

How to pass Mr. Delgado's math class:

1) Show up to class.

- Also means to show up on time & to abide by ALL class/school rules.

2) Do DAILY homework.

- Missing even one homework can cause students to miss necessary skills/standards needed for the next day and days following. If one skill/standard is missed, student is likely to struggle as class progresses.

3) Do DAILY homework completely / accurately / correctly.

- If homework is incorrect, exams will certainly be incorrect. Mr. Delgado supplies students with ALL answers on homework each day. Student must check ALL answers for accuracy on homework each day. Student may need to get outside tutoring to make sure a topic and steps are understood and mastered each day. The school offers FREE after-school tutoring each day.
- Each day, students begin homework in class. Mr. Delgado **does not** accept late homework (except for illness), incorrect homework, or incomplete homework (unless student has an IEP with modification).

4) Take ALL notes & know how to use them.

- Students are allowed to use notes on exams. Students are required to take down notes each day as Mr. Delgado has them written on board. This has proven to help students remember/master steps and concepts. Specific definitions or steps from notes may be asked on exams. Notes are also collected and graded as part of student's overall grade.

5) Retake tests/quizzes for a better grade.

- Student can retake any test/quiz as many times for a better grade. Mr. Delgado keeps the higher grade and previous lower grade is discarded.

Note:

- If a student has a low grade or is failing or fails, he/she has chosen not to do any one (or all) of the items listed above.
- 55% is passing
- Under no circumstances does Mr. Delgado pass students with an average of 55% or less—or issue credit without an average of 55% or higher.
